Part I: Course Objectives

After this course, you will be able to diagnose often over-looked growth and dental problems in children. Topics covered will include: frenectomies, canine impaction, crossbites, traumatic occlusion, anterior recession, and deep bites. Participants will be able to confidently screen for all early orthodontic interventions and become familiar with common treatment options through clinical cases.

Part II: Course Objectives

Participants will be able to take a look at the "bigger picture" and focus on the macro smile arch esthetic as it relates to the patient's overall face. Multiple interdisciplinary adult cases will be presented with a hands-on part of the course that is focused on diagnosing how orthodontics would be useful as part of a comprehensive restorative plan.
